No family and no girlfriend, a.k.a. XYL now. I get shivers just thinking of it even after 50 years have passed. I was a 19 year old

146.685- The initial id was shortened as per requested. County has installed a motion detection system inside the gates. So you need to make sure we contact dispatch before entering. DPW has added gravel to the roadway and leveled the driveway due to wash out.

444.750- Still working on coordination of the freq, eastern conference is ok with it, seems to be a problem with western ny conference, still working on getting this cleared, may need to change frequency...more to come ...ugg It is being said that an update is planned for the fusion repeaters but haven't seen it posted on the yaesu website yet. Russ N2IZV has been working with Wayne county IT to get wires x up and running... Justin W2JPT and Bill KD2DNO was at the EMO programming the new fusion rigs. They are also offering 2 training classes on how to use the new radios...nice work guys!! There is defiantly a learning curve on using the new radios as I can contest.

146.745- Added a holiday message that plays nightly @ 545pm. Shortened the initial id message to just the time and call. Adjusted the shed temperature and adjusted backup heater to 50 degrees in case primary heater fails. Have been working on a backup asterisk/allstar linux box with more cpu and a ssd hardrive to replace present computer. Continued work on linux program to clear up autopatch issue.

Been talking with local officials to see if we can get support for propane generator that would power the club shed and the shed for the village/school repeater as well.

VE sessions are held prior to their meeting. The VE testing is headed by Dave Foster, AB2WZO of SIARC. The SIARC website (www.SIARC.us) can be used for directions and information.

VE Testing At RIT

RARA conducts amateur radio license testing on the 3rd Saturday of each month from September through April and at the Rochester Hamfest.

Testing is conducted at Rochester Institute of Technology, Building 9, Room 3139 ([click for map](#)), Registration is at 10:00 AM. Bring a pen and pencil, two forms of ID including one with a picture. If you are upgrading: Bring your original, and a copy, of your current amateur radio license; or unexpired Certificates of Completion. RARA provides free testing sessions as a public service. Handicapped applicants are always welcome, Please notify us in advance if you need any special accommodations.
