Our part was sending the hospital status form given to us as quickly as possible which I am happy to say the crew of N2IZV, KB2FSB and N0EK was the first to get it sent between Wayne and Ontario Counties.

With a new digitized computer program form, these status reports were sent by Fldigi successfully. Repeater Report November 2016

146.745- After pumpkin patrol it was learned that some of the macros were not playing as they should, including the Direct Net Macro. After looking at the program, we changed the playback to TX2 port. On the old repeater it was played on TX1 port. This has been addressed. Most club announcements happen to broadcast in and around 6pm as reminders. Each month is a different message. 745 was very effective in coverage for the pumpkin patrol exercise.

146.685- A preamp was purchased for this machine in the spring. This was discussed before but the preamp was needed more on the .745 machine so was used there. A second preamp has now been purchased and installed on .685. Maybe this will help old "scratch and bacon frying" KB2KBY better make the repeater for the weekly nets!

444.750- It took some time to get the repeater back from Yaesu, It has been upgraded to 1.10Q the very latest update. Additionally, we were able to integrate the URDC (Universal Data Radio Controller) /Dstar module into the Fusion machine to make it a tri-mode repeater as planned. We have also tested the Wires-x link from the EMO and its working great! At some point members may need a program on how to work D-stars features (Maybe December?). I was able to connect into REFLECTOR 30C, which is based in Atlanta and had a quick conversation with an Alabama station as well as a gentlemen from the UK. If you are familiar with D-Star give it a try. You have to transmit your TO: information for a good 4 seconds before you get a response. This may be slightly different than a standard Dstar repeater, but once connected it works great!

Additionally- XARC radio club has asked me to give a presentation to them regarding the improvements that we have made with the DARC Repeaters. So I will be attending their regular meeting in January if anyone is interested. (2nd Thursday in Webster)
