"Why did I get into ham radio?"

I imagine that each of our stories is very interesting in how we embarked on becoming a Ham Radio operator.. My story is like a building block of items, from a youngster, to a teenager. The road included many Elmer's along the way.

As a child, I grew up in trailer park in the 80's and all my friends had those 27mhz walkie talkies. We would spend hours riding our bikes around playing in the woods using those "HT's".. Trying to keep ourselves entertained and "out of trouble". One of my friends father was a Ham and was avid CW op. He built all his equipment – Heathkits... On one occasion we ventured out to the Syracuse Hamfest...and on this trip I heard what a repeater was,(I think it was .745) for the first time. I was 11 at the time..

In the middle of the 5th grade we moved to our new house that my dad constructed near Port Gibson. (I helped nailing sheets of plywood, wiring outlets, etc. at an early age).Problem for me was that it was considered long-distance to talk from Newark to Palmyra on the telephone. So talking

with my friends was difficult as my parents were not interested in me racking up a phone bill. So we devised a plan to get a couple CB mobiles and antennas and use CB to talk back and forth. This only worked 50% of the time as conditions weren't always in our favor...

As time progressed, I found myself more and more interested in electronics. My parents had bought me one of the 160 in 1 electronic kits, from Radio Shack, for Christmas.. I literally went through all those kits, building an AM receiver, Morse code sender, etc. I really had a blast with that electronic kit.

In the middle of my sophomore of high school year, Feb.1991, there was a rumor that the FCC was going to eliminate code requirements. A co-worker of my mom was a ham, and suggested checking out the Drumlins Amateur Radio Club..and I did.. I was excited to learn that they were holding a class.. I participated in all the class, and took the exam at the April Hamfest.. I was 15 and got my radio license before I got my driver's license... In those days you had to pass the Novice license 40 questions and Tech 35 questions.. the question pool between them both was 800 questions. And not only did I remember all those 800 questions, I learned the material because of the hands on class... Out of the class we had like 22 new hams.!!! I took me 5 years after that to get my 5 WPM—but I did it..

So I guess I got into ham radio out a need of necessity, (No Internet in those days.), but also out of interest.. my interest in electronics which obviously I've made a career as a Electrical Controls Technician. I also find Ham radio as a hobby that never gets boring. With new technology, new challenges, new modes. I've been a ham for 30 years and still have not been able to do it all..

So writing this felt a little weird to do, but I guess if it helps anyone to self-reflect, and or inspires you

to submit an article to the newsletter I think it was worth it... So I ask **“Why did YOU get into Amateur Radio?”**

Keep radio alive before corporations take it away!




I sure fit that "fat Tuesday" even without Tuesday coming up February 23rd. Hi hi.
