Spring is just around the corner on the 20th, Tuesday. We'll see what Mother Nature has in store for us at the March DARC meeting. Hi. Spring also means our RACES-ARES schedule will be getting busier. George Bastedo, the EMO Director, emailed me he is planning a summer SKYWARN training some evening April 9th, 10th or 11th. That is either a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday evening. April 28th, Saturday, the Water Derby in Shortsville is on this year. We have helped our SIARC friends with that event. As more info comes around, I'll pass it on by the DARC email. The State Gina exercise is coming up too. The word from George is they have been given two different dates a month apart for the exercise. Hi. So keep you posted when the State comes through with their final date.

Bill, KD2DNO; Lew, WE2LEW; and I had a meeting with George in early March. Our new vertical HF antenna is in thanks to George. Jeff will need some help putting the new antenna up. One of our big problems with HF communications is our lack of a good HF wire antenna which

is off the EMO roof and quieter with QRN. Nothing permanently can be installed off the roof. But, George

agreed to a temporary wire antenna that could be reeled out and back in when needed. So the club is looking at an end fed wire antenna for that purpose where it would best be done.

What about the results of the COMEX 18-1? Well, "Region 2 performance achieved 100% reporting of the 83 counties. This is the third COMEX in a row to do so.... Region 2 places high priority on CW amateur nets and CW MARS nets for collection and processing of county data. This strategy has been extremely successful, particularly in collecting source data for "hard-to-get counties." One suggestion, "With the remarkable success of CW nets as described above, it is suggested that HQ post a reference to the COMEX CW nets on the USARMYMARS web site about them. As a result, amateur participation would greatly increase with County Status and other critical areas, indeed, expand the region new member base." I also suggested that a schedule be posted for nets on the 60mb interoperability frequency for voice county information. I haven't seen anything on that. Lloyd, KB2FSB, and I successfully make CW contacts on the 80mb frequency and Lloyd as well on the 40mb frequency. Me, with a MLA, magnetic loop antenna, with just 25 watts to Hicksville NY on 80m! That is about 175 miles away. I am just amazed! Voice? No way!

That is about it for March. I have to get this article off to Lew ASAP. I am late. But, got my 2017 taxes done. Hi. Spring? Come on! Truly get here. Hi. See you next month.


