I thank the club members that attended the **April** meeting for listening to the presentation with KB2KBY on "Grab and Poppy."

If you remember, last year in one of our monthly meeting presentations, I talked about my pre-ham days being a HF radio Soviet Ciphered Teletype Interceptor on the Island of Shemya 20 miles from the end of the Aleutian Chain of islands. The only way I knew of the full story I did and what NSA, the "guys" we were doing the intercept for, did with the electronic intelligence was when the Top Secret classifications were declassified and open to the public. This would be the early 1990s.

Mrs. Iris McConnell, one of the two people I worked with at NSA in 1966-68 when in the Army, sent me a big package this past month in the mail. In the mailing was a bunch of material which now declassified, told me the parts of my "mission" unknown until now-58 years later. The Top Secret material was declassified in 2004. Remember, in the intelligence community you are only trained enough to do your job." There was much going on but you are restricted by



"do you have the need know."

Now, that "need to know" was answered by Iris's

material. During the Cold War period 1948 to in the 1960s, intelligence gathering was done by ship, planes and bases of allies on the perimeter of Russia. To get intelligence inside Russia, it required high flying reconnaissance aircraft. One of most famous was U-2 built by Lockheed's "Skunk Works" in California. (The SR-71 Black Bird was also a Skunk Works invention.) Remember the 1960 U-2 with Francis Gary Powers shot down over Russia by a SAM 2 antiaircraft missile?



Johnson, Powers U2. He invented over 40 aircraft. He did not have a pilot license.


Soviets charge U-2 pilot with espionage, July 8, 1960

Well, Grab and Poppy were the first intelligence satellites launched for NSA. Grab was launched after the Russian Sputnik and before Powers was shot down. Poppy 1 was launched in 1962, Poppy 2 in 1965 and in 1967, Poppy 3 was launched. Well, there I was in this K-Section 1966-68. Poppy 2 and 3 were the satellites that I was looking over the IBM computer readouts those two years. True, I was not even given the Top Secret codenames "Grab" and "Poppy" at that



time. I didn't "need to know."

I often wondered why NSA needed a Soviet Ciphered Teletype Interceptor. Sure, I intercepted telemetry but not from satellites but Soviet HF transmissions from the ground going to Moscow. Researching Grab and Poppy, I found my Shemya did download the intelligence from Grab and Poppy in the big "bubble" inside the AAFJOG compound. I guess NSA figured since we all had the same Top Secret Crypto NSA clearances, I knew what the compound was doing. Hi hi! Surprise! I DO NOW!

Remember the Army Air Force Joint Operations Group building from my first presentation? ELINT, my HF intercept is **Electronic Intelligence**. TELINT is **Telemetry Intelligence**.

So, it is <u>only 58 years later</u>, KB2KBY <u>finally knows the "whole picture" of what my Army Security Agency and the Air Force</u> <u>Security Service were doing for NSA.</u> (Always the teacher, I know.)



Hi hi. That is exactly what I told my XYL too! This is no joke but the real truth.



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Don't we learn something new every day? Hi hi. I sure still do. It is a reason we all should pay more attention to DARC and RACES and ARES.



FCC Exposure Rules Soon to Affect Every US Radio Amateur

Gregory Lapin, PhD, PE, N9GL

Beginning May 3, all ham radio transmitters operating in the US will be expected to comply with new FCC rules governing RF exposure limits. These new rules, which went into effect in May 2021, raised many questions in the ham radio community. Gregory Lapin's, N9GL, article, "FCC Exposure Rules Soon to Affect Every US Radio Amateur," is a plain-language explanation of the FCC's expectations including information about how to perform the necessary assessments of your station. FRIENDLY...He/[She] operates slowly and patiently when requested; offers friendly advice and counsel to beginners; kind assistance, cooperation and consideration for the interests of others. These are the marks of the amateur spirit.

BALANCED...Radio is a hobby, never interfering with duties owed to family, job, school or community.

PATRIOTIC...His/[Her] station and skills are always ready for service to country and community.

POST SCRIPT: FYI IF YOU DIDN'T SEE THIS IN THE LOCAL NEWS. (I know the news can be depressing. If it does bother you what goes on, sure limit it or don't watch. As the history teacher I watch balanced <u>information</u> on the news to keep a good perspective of the truth.)

Hawaii is the center for the US Military's <u>Graves Registration</u>. The phrase "We Leave No Men Behind" refers to the continuing work of the Graves Registration Service under the Quartermaster Corp. The name was changed in 1991 to Mortuary Affairs now separate from the military and more civilian operated. Modern technology has given the Mortuary Affairs 100% identification ability making no one left behind. (There are some 70,000 MIAs from WW2 still.)



JOHN BLAKESLEE THOMAS, dob 5/20/1920 from North Rose, NY served during WW2 as a pilot of a bomber with rank of 1st Lt., he was assigned to 9th AAF, 34585, 98th BQ, flying a B-24. On August 1, 1943, while attacking the Ploesti Oil Fields, his bomber was shot down by Anti-aircraft fire. His remains were recently recovered at what may have been a former POW camp for air crews in Hungary. In September 2022, these remains were identified as his, and his family was notified.

On Friday, May 12, his remains are to be flown to the Syracuse Airport around 6pm and taken to Farnsworth-Keysor Funeral Home in North Rose. There will be public calling hours from 3pm - 7pm on Friday, May 19. His service will take place on Saturday, May 20, at 11am. Following the service, he will be buried in the Rose cemetery on Route 414 (1.5 miles south of the funeral home). It is expected the public will line Route 414 with flags and honors as the procession goes by. There will be a full military funeral by the US Army at the cemetery. (There will be no public parking at the cemetery.)
