
RACES-ARES NOVEMBER 2023

2024 Tour de Cure (email from KD2DNO, Bill)

The 2024 Finger Lakes Region Tour de Cure will be held on Saturday June 8, 2024 with a change to the route and host site. The host site will be Finger Lakes Community College in Canandaigua, NY and the routes will leave from and return to that location. There will be 4 ride courses with lengths of 63, 40, 25, and 12 miles. The 63 mile ride extends from Canandaigua, south to Naples west of Canandaigua Lake returning from just west of Geneva. The shorter ride courses loopback between Canandaigua and Geneva. This change in location will necessitate a completely new plan for communications and rest stops.

NOVEMBER PROGRAM

Electronics Manufacturing in America - GE Electronics Park



Eighty years ago The General Electric Company built a large electronics manufacturing plant in Liverpool, near Syracuse New York. Known as "Electronics Park" it employed around 19,000 people by the early 1960s, building consumer, military, commercial and industrial electronics. Long after television manufacturing left Electronics Park, color CRTs continued to be made there. Long time GE employee and Antique Wireless association member Steve Auyer tells the story of Electronics Park in this 2006 production from the Liverpool Public Library. (The "BIG ALICE" radar of my Shemya in 1965-66 was built here by GE. Remember?)

The rise in phenomenal aurora displays doesn't look like it will stop anytime soon.




The next four to five years will provide optimal conditions for some dazzling aurora displays. (Image credit: Noppawat Tom Charoensinphon via Getty Images)

The 2023/24 "aurora season" has begun and is ramping up to something quite spectacular in the next few years. Here's why aurora activity is on the rise and why now is the best time to plan your northern lights adventure.

<u>Auroras</u> have intrigued humans for millennia with their wispy ribbons of light dancing across the sky. Known as the aurora borealis or the northern lights in the northern hemisphere and aurora australis or southern lights in the southern hemisphere, this spectacle is one of the most beautiful natural phenomena in the world.

They are triggered when energized particles from the sun slam into <u>Earth's atmosphere</u> at speeds of up to 40 million mph (72 million kph). The particles are then redirected toward the poles by our planet's <u>magnetic field</u>, creating colorful curtains of light across the sky.
